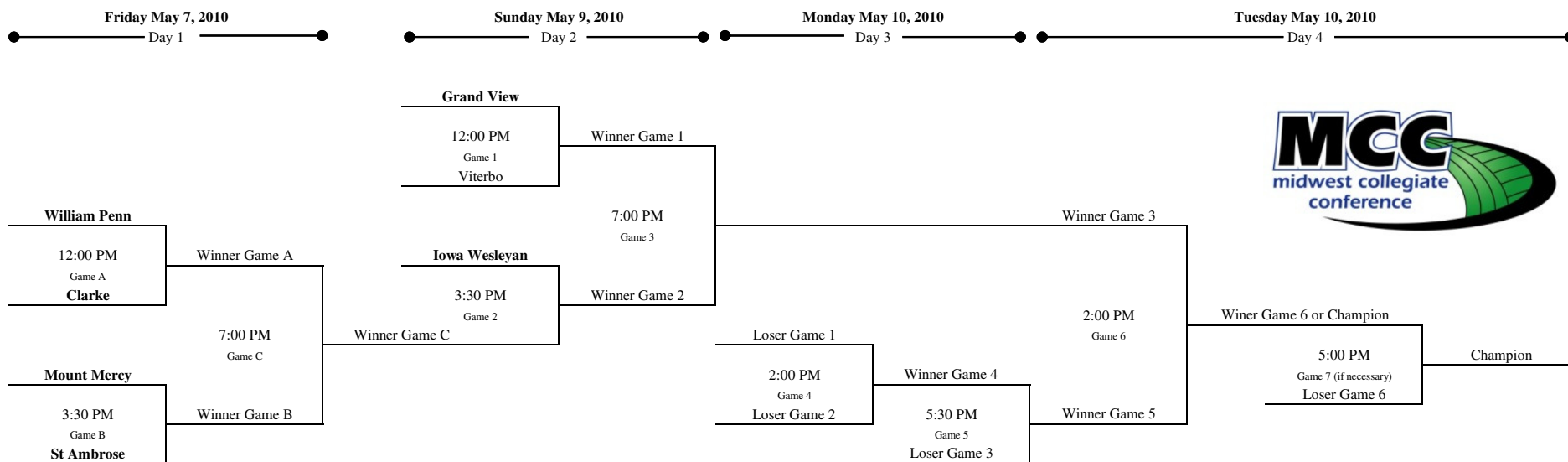

NOTES:

1. MCC Baseball Coaches Meeting - Tuesday May 4, 2010 at 10:00 am. Hosted by Mount Mercy College.
2. Tournament Director. 8th and 9th place head coaches are to serve as Tournament Co-Directors. Tournament Co-Directors are responsible for on-site functions including but not limited to setting official game times, overseeing field preparation, coordinating initial team baseball submissions, umpire hospitality, timing infield/outfield, coordinating and timing batting practice schedules, in consultation with the umpire crew serve as in-game rules mediator, and aid in the awarding of the conference championship presentation. The Tournament Co-Directors will also meet with the Conference Commissioner and Liason AD at the conclusion of the MCC Baseball Coaches meeting held a few days in advance of the tournament. It is expected that plans will be finalized and last minute needs will be addressed during this time.
3. The Conference Commissioner and Liason AD. The Conference Commissioner and Liason AD will be responsible for making necessary plans prior to the tournament. Duties include but are not limited to securing qualified and competent officials, athletic trainers (including water and ice in each dugout), sports information directors, game announcer, scoreboard operator, championship game photographer, championship awards (trophies) and serve as the on-field presenter of the conference tournament championship trophy. It is also suggested that one of the two be in attendance each day of the tournament.
4. Conference Chair. The Conference Chair, in consultation with the Conference Commissioner and the other Conference Coaches, will be responsible for suggesting and securing the tournament location as well as a back up venue.
5. Weather recommendations.

The Conference Commissioner, Conference Athletic Director Liason and the Conference Chair should work with the host site to secure an alternate site within 120 miles. Note - EVERY EFFORT MUST BE MADE TO COMPLETE THE TOURNAMENT ON THE FIELD. Thursday of the following week is the hard deadline for the Midwest Collegiate Conference automatic qualifier. According to the weather policy below, the single elimination portion (day 1) is given three full days (through Saturday) to complete its portion - if not, the conference automatically moves into the double elimination portion starting no later than Sunday. This leaves five full days to complete the remaining three days. The tournament site supervisor (in consultation with the tournament committee) is the final authority on implementation and administration of the inclement weather policy. See

inclement weather policy below:

1. If the tournament cannot be played at all, the #1 seed is the champion.
2. If games A and B can not be completed by Sunday, the #4 seed would advance to Game 2 (starting no later than Monday).
3. If games A and B are completed, but C cannot be completed by Sunday, the highest remaining seed would advance to Game 2 (starting no later than Monday).
4. If on day two, games 1 and 2 are started but cannot be completed before the completion date, the #1 seed is the champion.
5. If on day two, games 1 and 2 are completed but the rest of the tournament cannot be completed, the champion will be the highest seeded team that is undefeated.
6. If on day two, games 1, 2 and 3 are completed but the rest of the tournament cannot be completed, the champion will be the winner of game 3.
7. If on day three, game 4 is completed but the rest of the tournament cannot be completed, the champion will be the undefeated team.
8. If on day three, games 4 and 5 are completed but the rest of the tournament cannot be completed, the champion will be the undefeated team.
9. If on day four, game 6 is completed AND a game 7 is necessary but cannot be played before the completion date, the champion will be the winner of game 6.
10. If the first three days cannot be played and only the last day is available, the tournament will revert to a single elimination tournament - games 1, 2 and 3.
11. If the first two days of the double elimination cannot be played but the last two days are available, then games 1-4 will be played on the first available day and games 5-7 will be played on the second available day. The champion will be the winner of game 6 or game 7 (if necessary).

6. All games must be played in full in order to be considered a complete game (Games A, B and C will be the only games to have the 10 run rule in effect after 7 innings).
